My dear CWL sisters and Spiritual Advisors:

"Let us all remember this: one cannot proclaim the Gospel of Jesus without the tangible witness of one's life. Those who listen to us and observe us must be able to see in our actions what they hear from our lips, and so give glory to God! I am thinking now of some advice that Saint Francis of Assisi gave his brothers: preach the Gospel and, if necessary, use words. Preaching with your life, with your witness." Pope Francis (4/14/13)

It was such an honour to represent you once again at the provincial and national conventions. The **provincial convention** in Toronto in July focused on issues around homelessness. Nineteen members from the Sault Ste. Marie diocese witnessed a very emotionally charged convention.... lots of reflection, sharing and generosity abounding. The response to the collection of Tim Horton's and McDonald's gift cards was overwhelming with \$12,044.50 in donations brought to convention for distribution in the Toronto area and an additional \$3,110.00 in gift cards was distributed locally by councils in their own communities.

There were a variety of breakout sessions from which to choose and all dealt on some level with our provincial theme of "homelessness". The keynote speakers from PEACH (Palliative Education and Care for the Homeless) left a lot to think about - how the homeless are left to die without dignity. Read the provincial website for more. The oral reports by the Diocesan Presidents and Provincial Officers were on homelessness and reflected on one of the titles of Mary. They were inspiring! You can read them on the provincial website, too.

At the banquet on Tuesday evening, everyone was ecstatic when Cardinal Thomas Collins presented the Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice medal to a very deserving Margaret Ann Jacobs, our then National President. The *Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice* (Latin: *For Church and Pope*) is also known as the "Decoration of Honour". It is currently conferred for distinguished service to the church by lay people and clergy.

The Sault Ste. Marie delegation had tee shirts made and we had a wonderful time and lots of laughs playing Diocesan Feud – we didn't win but had fun in typical CWL fashion. There is a report on the provincial website. Please take a couple of minutes to read the full convention details on the provincial website. In Winnepeg at the **national convention** in August, nine members from the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie attended. I can't begin to describe the feeling of sisterhood that is shared and the sense of the might that we have in our resolutions process. It is amazing to see the procession of flags and the liturgical procession of bishops, archbishops and spiritual advisors from across Canada. It was especially nice to see the Ukrainian Orthodox Bishop in his colourful attire.

The keynote speaker on Tuesday afternoon was Most Reverend Murray Chatlain, Archbishop of Keewatin-Le Pas who did two presentations. In the first, he spoke every passionately about reconciliation with indigenous peoples. I won't go into detail about his presentation other than to comment on his opening remarks. The first step in reconciliation is freedom (vs. fear or entrapment) If we surrender the things we cannot control there is freedom. The three principles for reconciliation are: 1) we are all part of a common humanity, 2) we all have the capacity to evolve and change, and 3) we yearn for unity and peace.

His second presentation was entitled "Listen Slowly". Listen to God in a quiet place where Jesus tells you he loves you. Faith and doubt are part and parcel of our religion. Jesus' apostles were with him for three years yet they doubted. Doubt is part of our faith. Uncertainty keeps us praying, keeps us humble, and also gives us room to grow. Both presentations were enlightening and thought provoking. Please go to the national website and watch these presentations.

We, the members, spoke and national listened...... The report of the Strategic Planning Committee, including the results of the spring surveys, were presented at the 2018 national convention and next steps, which included a five-year plan, were announced. I circulated the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan to all council presidents to share with members. Presentations will be delivered this fall at each of the regional meetings scheduled in Sudbury for October 21, North Bay November 3 and Sault Ste. Marie November 10th. Hopefully you will be able to attend one to learn about what has been done to date and next steps.

Save the date! Our diocesan convention will be at the Quattro Hotel and Convention Centre in Sault Ste. Marie April 26 to 28, 2019. Convention planning has begun and we all are ready to offer you a wonderful experience. Please set money aside when you do your 2019 budget to send delgates to the convention. It is a wonderful way to educate your members.

Speaking of education, "Find Your Voice!" has been presented in all regions. If you aren't able to attend or have missed the fall presentations there will be more in the spring. This is a dynamite course aimed at helping you to be comfortable speaking to an audience. And it's so much fun...just ask someone who attended.

Our *Homelessness* focus continues. Directives from the provincial Community Chairperson, Joanna Sisk and Communications Chairperson, Marie-Theresa Lamphier introduced a program called "Warmth and Comfort", whereby we are asking the councils to collect socks for men, women and children and donate these to local organizations. We are hoping to collect 2,019 pairs of socks by January 1, 2019. Collect and donate those socks to any local organization and send pictures and numbers on to Marie-Theresa. I thank you all in advance for your spirit of generosity. I know this will be a success in our diocese. Our councils are always so giving. Please do not hesitate to contact any of the diocesan executive with questions or suggestions. Our goal continues to be *visible* and to *communicate*. We are here for you!



In memory of Adele Beckerton CWL Council President St. Sebastien

This year, we bid farewell to a long serving and faithful CWL council president, member and friend.

Adele was born in St. Pierre de Montmagny, Quebec, on January 10, 1916 and was raised in Ontario. She lived on John Island, in Spragge, and in Spanish ,Ontario. Adele raised 10 children equally divided between girls and boys.

She joined the CWL, in Spanish at the encouragement of her Aunt Anna (Cote) Beauchamp at 18 yrs. of age.

She thought the membership was around \$2.00 at the time. She had been a member of the CWL for over 80 years, and during that time she has been to Conventions in Sault Ste. Marie and Sudbury, Ontario. She was at the CWL Anniversary Celebration in Killarney Ontario and served as both Treasurer and President in the Spanish CWL. Other CWL memories are of assisting and supporting families in her home community when the need arose, caused by catastrophic life events such as a house fire or serious injury or illness. Another memory was the CWL purchasing 10 yards of flannelette to be presented to expectant mothers to be used for making diapers for their new babies.

St. Sebastien Parish in Spanish, started out as a chapel for the small community,



served by the Jesuit Priests who were residents at the Garnier Boys School. Although the Chapel congregation was mainly a French speaking population, everyone was welcome.

Due to declining membership, the CWL decided to 'twin' some groups in smaller communities. This resulted in the St. Sebastien CWL being twinned with St. Francis of Assisi in Walford.

Adele had a heart attack last year but besides arthritis in her knees making ambulation difficult and loss of hearing she was in relatively good health. After a short time in Hospital in Guelph with her two daughters at her side she passed away very peacefully on March 2, 2018.

Sudbury is the health care centre for the north for trauma, cardiac, cancer, obstetrical and prenatal care. People from outside of Sudbury often feel isolated and alone when they come to Sudbury for health care. Sometimes they have had no chance to prepare for the transfer and sometimes they know ahead of time that they are coming here for care and are here for a lengthy stay.

Recognizing this problem the CWL councils in Sudbury set up a "Sisterhood Project" to provide emotional and spiritual support for their sisters in the League who request our help and support.

St. Patrick's parish is only one block from Health Science North and the Cancer Treatment Centre. Their council will be the initial contact point and they will be sharing this project with other councils in the city. The request for our support must come from the patient or their family member.

Services we hope to provide include:

- 1. Placement of intentions on the Prayer Chain in our parishes.
- 2. Provide support to the family during critical care or surgery if requested.
- 3. Fellowship and a friendly visit to facilitate family respite.
- 4. Provide a sympathetic ear and encouragement during this stressful time. Whatever you feel we can help you with.


